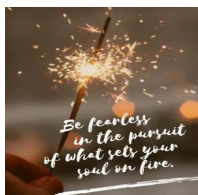

Attendance

Although attendance is gradually improving across the school, we are still falling well below our school target of **96%** with current school attendance for the academic year of **94.1%**

We currently have a number of children that are considerably below this threshold whose attendance falls below 90%. Any child that falls below this threshold is classified as a **Persistent Absence**.

Over the coming weeks, all parents of children whose attendance is below 90% will be invited into school to discuss their child's attendance further. This will help us to work together to identify strategies of improving attendance and ensuring that your children are in school, on time everyday to receive the education that they are legally entitled to. Letters requiring parents to attend meetings will be sent out in due course.

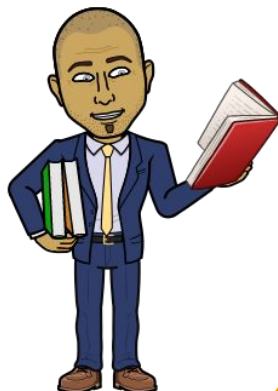
This ensures that we are safeguarding our children and our parents. Thank you for your continued support and cooperation.
