

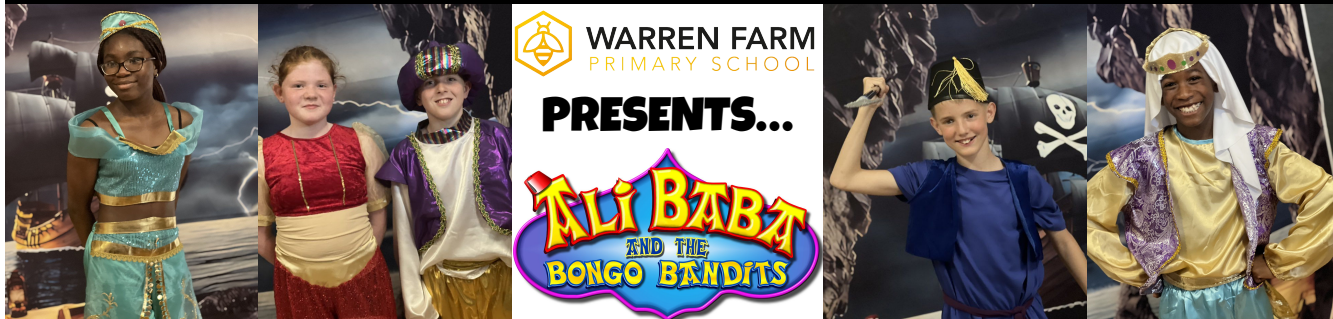

Message from Mr Taylor

I can't quite believe that I am writing the penultimate newsletter of the academic year. School is always a hive of activity, but at this time of year there are a number of additional activities and opportunities to celebrate our successes as we prepare to end one academic year and transition into the next.

This week, our amazing year 6 children and teachers invited parents/carers to their end of year production 'Ali Baba and the Bongo Bandits'. Opportunities such as this in the curriculum are important as they help promote courage, confidence and character in our children. They were a credit to their parents/carers and the school, demonstrating how 'Excellence in Everything' is at the heart of everything that we do at Warren Farm. A special thank you to Ms Purcell, Mrs Wood and Miss Barr-Groves who worked tirelessly to plan, support and deliver such an amazing performance.

On Tuesday this week we received our final external outcomes from Year 6 SATS. SATS is an opportunity for our children to demonstrate the progress they make during their time at Warren Farm and all of the hard work that they demonstrate on a daily basis. We are all incredibly proud of how our children applied themselves with outcomes for working at the expected standard of: **Maths 73% , Reading 75%, Writing 68% , Grammar Punctuation and spelling 86%** with a **combined figure (children achieving the expected standard in Maths, Reading and Writing) of 57%** - just 1 child below the national figure of 59%. Our outcomes across the school are shared later in the newsletter

Next week is our final week of this academic year and we look ahead to the graduation of our Nursery children on Monday and our Year 6 awards assembly and Prom on Tuesday. These will be lovely opportunities to celebrate our youngest members of the school at the beginning of their journey at Warren Farm and celebrate the successes of our eldest children during their time at Warren Farm. Importantly, it provides us all with one more week to demonstrate **Excellence in Everything**

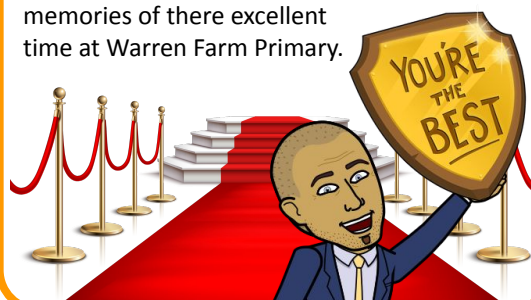
ATTENDANCE

This week we rewarded the children who had 96% attendance for the year. A bouncy castle was placed in the school hall and children took it in turns to enjoy their attendance prize. From the start of this academic year, 96% attendance has been our school target and the children are encouraged to aspire to this and beyond. 96% attendance means that your child should have no more than 7 days off school throughout the academic year. Think about the learning that has been missed whilst they have had those 7 days off. As a school we do understand that there will be periods of sickness, however when your child is well enough bring them back into school. If they complain that they are not well bring them into school and we can always ring you if they worsen. Leave in term time can also affect this percentage and negatively impact a child's overall school attendance for the year. Once again, next year there will be a range of attendance prizes and initiatives throughout the year so try to be part of them by ensuring you are in school, on time EVERYDAY!

SAFEGUARDING

This week's focus is water safety. During the summer months many families will be visiting the beach or swimming pools, it is important that you discuss with your child some of the dangers they may face with vast areas of water.
