This week I shared some exciting news on Class Dojo about future developments

over the coming months at Warren Farm including our new EYFS Hub, school library and media suite. The coming years promise to be an exciting period of change and a valuable opportunity to move into a positive future for our children. Thank you to those parents that have taken the time to speak to me at the start and end of the day at the school gates and on the playground - your positive feedback is greatly appreciated. Together we have created a culture that nourishes our vision of *Excellence in Everything* which is a continual process of development and evolution on a daily basis. Our values of Courage, Honesty, Integrity, Respect and Self Discipline are merely a starting point, but it's our actions in bringing these to life which will ultimately make the real difference to the culture and environment that we are building at Warren Farm.

Our rich and varied curriculum offer ensures that Excellence in Everything is evident and delivered beyond the classroom walls. This week Key stage 1 began the first of 3 visits to Warwick castle to support their learning in History and on Friday, children from Years 3 and 4 attended a dance festival at Elmhurst ballet school, demonstrating our continued commitment to the arts.

Following our Ofsted graded **GOOD** inspection in September 2023, we were given only 3 development points - one of which related directly to attendance. "Some pupils have low attendance and are persistently absent. This leads to gaps in their learning and lower achievement ." (Ofsted Sept 2023). Attendance matters - I can't put it any simpler than that! We currently have 335 children on roll at Warren Farm with waiting lists in five year groups. This week, a number of families with unauthorised absence (not notifying the school) let the team of 335 down. To those of you who were in school or that took the time to notify us of a genuine illness, please continue to set the example and demonstrate Excellence in Everything. Thank you for your continued hard work and support - it really is a team effort. Let's see an improvement to demonstrate Excellence in Everything next week.
